(Dweck, 2014).



Students that hold a fixed mindset give up when they can't solve a problem and admit defeat. This can be detrimental to students' future efforts and leads to limited student growth. With a growth mindset, students continually work to improve their skills, leading to greater growth and ultimately, success. We want all pupils at YBA to have a growth mindset and be the successful young people they deserve to be.

Passport to Prom.

Students began their prom passport on 2nd December. They need to obtain 40 stamps to pay their deposit by 11th April 2025. 80 stamps need to obtained to pay the whole balance (TBC).




Students must have a positive score of 100 behaviour points.

They will get stamps from teachers or form tutors by doing the following:

- Wow cards 2 Stamps
- GCSE POD watching 10 pods 1 Stamp
- Attendance of 96 or above each week 1 Stamp
- B4L each half term 5 stamps.

All other decisions regarding admittance to the Prom will be at the discretion of the Head Teacher and, as all other decisions made at school, individual circumstances will always be taken into account.
