Letter from Mrs L. Thorpe, Chair of Governors:

#### Dear Parents / Carers

In the Autumn term I had the privilege of being re-elected as Chair of the Governing Body for the second year. Since I wrote to you last year, the Governing Body has worked closely with the Head and the Senior Leadership Team, particularly to ensure that the recommendations from the Estyn inspection have been implemented. When the Inspection Team revisited the school I was involved in a detailed, challenging interview which covered a wide range of issues. I was really surprised at the depth of questioning given that the inspectors had been in the school for a relatively short space of time, so I was confident that they were going to make an informed decision at the end of their visit. When they recommended that the school was removed from Estyn monitoring I felt that this was a huge step forward for the school, whilst recognising that actually it was just the next step on the school's plan for continued improvement.

As a Governing Body we have the challenge of meeting the newly introduced statutory training requirements introduced by the Welsh Government to improve the work of the Governing Body in coming months. As Chair of Governors I try to visit the school on a weekly basis—I often accompany the Head when he conducts an unplanned walk around the school to observe standards of behaviour and to be aware of the school environment in general. As a parent, I am assured that the school always presents an orderly, business like environment.

As we now look forward to future plans, I am pleased that we will work jointly with the Local Authority to monitor the progress of the school. I will be pleased to welcome you at the Annual General Meeting for parents.

#### DEVELOPMENT PLAN

Governors were generally pleased with the KS3 results for the school, which were broadly in line with other schools like ours. We were pleased with KS4 results in general, however performance remains a priority within Ysgol Bryn Alyn. The focus on performance includes a strategy for exam entry and resits. We have listened to the school's plans and targets for the present year 11 cohort and are confident that our pupils will have every opportunity to succeed at Ysgol Bryn Alyn. Here is a summary of the plans to improve learner outcomes at

KS4 that have been agreed by Governors:

- Maintain the 92% pupil attendance target set by WAG. This will be achieved by close monitoring of attendance patterns by achievement coordinators supported by our Home School Liaison Officer and Education Social Worker.
- All staff in school are rigorously involved in monitoring and tracking pupils, so that every effort is made to help pupils achieve their target grade. Teachers will continue to offer twilight sessions for catch-up, and offer revision sessions in the half term holidays and Easter break leading up to external examinations. We are very grateful for the hard work and dedication shown by members of staff.
- Procedures that the school introduced last year to improve performance will be in place again this year. The time that pupils will be left unsupervised to carry out their own revision programme will be curtailed, and pupils will be required to come into school for timetabled revision sessions. The year 11 prom will not take place until all external examinations are complete.

#### **Priorities:**

- 1. Improve learner outcomes at KS4
- 2. Further embed whole school Literacy and Numeracy strategies to improve outcomes at both key stages
- 3. Further develop assessment and monitoring procedures
- 4. Improve the use of the school's evidence base that informs intervention/learning and teaching strategies
- 5. Develop the depth of the school's analysis and the implementation of appropriate strategies for identified groups of learners

#### LINKS TO THE COMMUNITY

#### **FEEDER SCHOOLS**

We have excellent relationships with our feeder schools and enjoy regular contact through curricular and pastoral links. We provide an enhanced transition programme for those pupils who need extra support and guidance in relation to moving to secondary school. We have recently developed our links by producing a cluster newsletter. The school also runs a parental contact group programme "Talk to Talk" where parents with children in our school come and discuss issues and problems that they may have. We arrange a range of activities for the group.

#### **OUTSIDE AGENCIES**

We have regular contact with outside agencies in order to support our pupils. Agencies include CYPS, Police, Educational Psychologists and counselling support groups. The school is closely supported by the school's police liaison officer who regularly visits PSE lessons, and contributes to our Health days and the year 7 "Crucial Crew" event. Presentations have been given to our pupils from a range of outside providers to support the emotional and physical well being of our pupils. We are planning to develop this work by running a number of sessions on well being in July 2014.

#### **WORK EXPERIENCE**

Over the years we have developed good links with local employers, and our pupils have been welcomed into local businesses to facilitate work experience.

#### **ESTYN INSPECTION**

We had a monitoring visit from Estyn in December 2013. They recommended that Ysgol Bryn Alyn be removed from Estyn's monitoring list. Estyn's judgement was that we had made good progress towards the recommendations from the May 2012 inspection. This is a testament to the hard work by pupils, teachers and support staff. #### **Well Being Centre (WBC)**

Our well being centre has been operating for sixteen months now and is a valuable addition to the care and support we offer our pupils. WBC is a place where pupils can seek support and guidance throughout the day. Since the introduction of the WBC our external exclusions have decreased significantly. The WBC consists of two main parts; a community room where focus groups meet and discuss issues and our reflection room, Cyfle Newydd (New Opportunity) where pupils are placed when their behaviour has been so unacceptable that an immediate return to the classroom is not appropriate.

Here are a few comments made by the pupils themselves about how important the centre is.

"If the Wellbeing Centre wasn't here I couldn't come to school"

"It is a safe place to talk about how you are feeling"

"There is always someone there to listen"

"The groups really help - I am now able to ask questions in class"

"If it wasn't for me joining one of the groups I would still be behind with my work"

"I can talk about anything"

"Being able to talk to someone helps me through the day"

"Being part of the group helps me cope with things at home"


"I am a lot calmer now"

"I know where to go if I am in trouble or not coping"


"I think every school should have a Wellbeing Centre"

#### **Healthy Schools (continued)**

#### Canteen

The catering team at Ysgol Bryn Alyn provide a variety of freshly prepared nutritious meals, using basic wholesome ingredients. Our menus comply with the nutritional standards for school lunches set by the Welsh Government.

We encourage children to choose a healthy meal from our daily dishes which include salads and vegetable choices, along with a variety of carbohydrates alternatives including pasta and rice. Chips are only available once a week.

We also have monthly theme days which have included Chinese, Mexican and American.

There is a pre order system in place for pupils to use in the mornings.

#### **Toilets**

The toilets are cleaned daily. Additional toilet facilities have been provided in the newly built science block. Access to toilets is generally restricted to break and lunch times. There are disabled toilet facilities in each area of the school. In the last four years about a quarter of a million pounds has been spent on improving the toilet facilities for pupils.
