

We adapted the Matiau laith to help us teach French language patterns. We thank Mrs L. Jones (Head of Year 7: YBA) for helping us!





Year 7 pupils entered a competition for Inter Faith week in November where they had to hunt for a series of letters around school to decipher a message.



A fantastic opportunity which allowed the children to push themselves and reach new heights.






Eco-Readymix Competition
