The topic in Key Stage 2 this term has been 'Safety'. The children have been learning about keeping safe in real life situations:

- Children in years 5 and 6 visited DangerPoint to learn about lots of different scenarios and how to keep safe including online safety.
- Children in year 5 and 6 participated in **Bikeability** to learn about how to ride bikes safely on the road.
- PC Stu came in to speak to the children about speed awareness. The children used a device to measure the speed of cars travelling past our school; encouraging everyone to keep to the 20mph speed limit to keep our community safe.
