Prince's Trust—STEM Session



Given to Shine Launch

On Monday 4th February, all YBA female pupils were invited to an Assembly that introduced the 'Given to Shine' initiative. This is a scheme which will allow girls to be given, free of charge, reusable sanitary products so that they can make careful choices about what products to use in light of personal issues of comfort, the hugely topical worldwide issue of plastic disposal (e.g. there are four plastic bags in one single use pad), as well as helping to tackle the problem of 'period poverty' in the area. Following a survey of 500 pupils across the Wrexham Borough, more than a quarter of pupil respondents have taken time off secondary school in the last year because of lack of access to sanitary products.

Support in the form of funding for this initiative has been given by the National Lottery, Skipton Building Society and Lush, to name but a few. All girls in the Wrexham, Denbighshire, Flintshire, West Cheshire and Wirral areas will be given a pack free of charge, we were lucky enough to be the first launch school. The pack included instructions and a selection of different size sanitary towels or, if the girls prefer, reusable 'cups' for those who use Tampons. A speaker from the 'Given to Shine' initiative explained to the girls how to use them and the benefits of use both to them and the environment before handing them out at the end of the assembly.



On the 21st February MP Ian Lucas joined us to discuss the scheme and lend his support

ALN Students

The Welsh Government is introducing a new, simpler and more responsive system of meeting the needs of children with special educational needs or disabilities. These changes will happen gradually over the next few years following the timeline below:



The Additional Learning Needs and Education Tribunal (Wales) Act (ALNET) has been passed and will be supported by a new code. This sets out how the ideas from the act will work in practice. The draft code was published in December 2018 and a consultation to gather the thoughts and feelings of professionals, parents, carers, children and young people will last until the 22nd of March 2019.

As from 5th November 2018, we will no longer be able to accept cash payments into the school.
